## NOTICE OF REGATTA

BRITISH ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS 2010 HEADLINES:

- Junior, Under 23, Lightweight, Senior and Adaptive events
- Single sculling events for all adaptive classifications
- Time trials for all events with an entry of 25 or above
- Entries through BROE by 3.00pm Monday 5th July 2010 – please ensure your BROE contact details are up to date

- Finals of all J14, J15 and J16 events on Saturday
- See www.britchamps.org for pre-Regatta competitor and spectator information
- Provisional draw to be posted on website Thursday 8th July 2010
- Entry fees held at 2008 levels



#### **ENTRIES**

Entries must be made through BROE. Entries must be submitted by 3.00pm on Monday 5th July 2010 when the system will be closed.

Please note when submitting entries through BROE:

- Payment should be made by credit or debit card through BROE if possible
- All possible contact details should be completed. We may need to contact you before or during the Regatta, so it's in your interests to ensure your contact details are accurate and up to date.
- A copy of the draw and other information will be emailed to the submitting club's BROE administrator on Thursday 8th July. You should ensure that this email address is monitored and up-to-date.
- You should check that you comply with the Conditions of Entry to the Regatta.

If it is necessary to send a cheque, please:

- ♦ Make the cheque payable to "British Rowing"
- Enclose with it details of the club, the contact person and the events entered.
- Post it to the Entries Secretary, British Rowing Championships at 4 Lyncombe Hill, Bath, BA2 4PG to reach the Entries Secretary by 3.00pm on Monday 5th July 2010. If the cheque is late, the entry will be rejected.
- Note that, if the cheque is short by more than the payment for one crew, then that crew will be treated as a late entry and rejected.

Do phone the entries helpline if you would like to ensure that your cheque has been received.

#### PLEASE NOTE:

- Neither late entries nor late payment will be accepted.
- Requests for amendments to the published draw which arise from mistakes made by the organising committee will be rectified.
- Requests for amendments to the published draw which arise from mistakes made by competitors may be rectified at the organising committee's discretion as long as they are received by 4pm on Monday 12th July 2010. Any such requests should be submitted by email to entries@britchamps.org. Please note that replies will not be available before this deadline.
- If a crew scratches before the Regatta and this makes a major change to race timings, this information will be posted on the website as soon as possible. It is the competitor's duty to check for updates.

#### THE DRAW

The draw will take place at British Rowing on Wednesday 7th July 2010. No details will be disclosed before Thursday 8th July 2009 when the provisional draw will be published on the website www.britchamps.org. An information pack containing the provisional draw, general instructions, and safety instructions will be emailed to the BROE administrator for each submitting club and these documents will also be posted on the website in pdf format. This information will not be routinely sent by post, although arrangements will be made for any club which cannot receive its documents by email or download them from the website.

#### **TIMETABLE**

The final race timetable is subject to change until all crews intending to race have checked in at the Regatta. The following plan is indicative only. For more detailed information, visit the website: www.britchamps.org

#### FRIDAY WILL INCLUDE:

J14, J15 and J16 time trials, eliminators, repechages and semifinals; J17 and Junior time trials and eliminators.

#### **SATURDAY WILL INCLUDE:**

J14, J15 and J16 finals; J17 repechages and semi-finals; Junior time trials, eliminators, repechages and semi-finals; U23, Lightweight and Senior time trials and eliminators.

#### **SUNDAY WILL INCLUDE:**

J17 finals; Junior, U23, Lightweight and Senior repechages, semi-finals and finals; Adaptive time trials, eliminators, repechages, semi-finals and finals.

#### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- 1 The British Rowing Championships are open to all clubs affiliated to any Great Britain Rowing Body. Individual competitors, including substitutes, must have been registered members of their declared club(s) since before 1st June 2010.
- 2. The British Rowing Championships are a national event. Foreign entries are specifically excluded. In addition, no competitor who has represented a foreign country at any event or competed for a foreign club at Henley Women's Regatta or Henley Royal Regatta in the current year may participate in any event at the British Rowing Championships.
- 3. Competitors will provide their own equipment. The use of FISA Standard Adaptive boats is mandatory.
- 4. Entries from British Rowing's Junior Squad are required to comply with the instructions for and conditions of entry in all respects. However, the crew composition may be changed in its entirety after the closing date, provided that those name changes are supplied in writing to the Entries Secretary by Tuesday 13th July 2010. After this time no further changes may be made unless for certified medical reasons. Crews using this condition may only compete in Senior Events of the Regatta.
- 5. The organising committee reserves the right to exclude any crew or sculler from further competition in an event if it does not show sufficient competence in either attaching to the start pontoons or progressing down the course during a race. This rule will be applied in the interests of safety and fairness to other competitors.

#### REGULATIONS FOR RACING

- 6. The Regatta is held under the Rules of British Rowing and the British Rowing Rules of Racing will apply.
- 7. No provision will be made for multiple entries.
- 8. To win a medal it will be necessary for a crew to beat another crew, except for gold in the event of withdrawals. Events (other than adaptive events) attracting fewer than three entries at the close of entries will be withdrawn. If there is only one entry in an adaptive W 1x event, that competitor will be offered a place in the equivalent (LTA, TA or AS) Open 1x event.
- 9. Entry fees will not be refundable if it should become necessary, for any reason, to abandon the Championships or any event.
- 10. When it is not possible, for whatever reason, to complete the Championships or an event, the draw pattern may be changed or times from time trials, heats, repechages or semi-finals may be used to determine which crews progress to later rounds, or the medal positions.
- 11. Events where the entry is 25 or more will be the subject of a time trial over 1500 m to reduce the entry to 12. There will then be two semi-finals. Details of these time trials will be published on the Regatta website as part of the provisional draw.

- 12. Even if the number of crews registering for a time trial in any event falls below 25, the time trial will still go ahead.
- 13. Entrants who fail to confirm their entry according to Instruction 18 below will not be permitted to start. Those who have confirmed but then fail to appear at the start for any of their races in the event may be disbarred from other events in the Championships.
- 14. Withdrawal after an entrant's first race will be allowed if notice is given to the Entries Secretary and there are acceptable reasons, or the entrant's next race is a repechage.
- 15. Any crew which does not present a complete set of licences and then wins a medal may not be presented with any medals until the missing licences are provided.
- 16. It is the competitor's responsibility to keep himself informed of any changes to the event programme.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS TO COMPETITORS**

- 17. Competitors who decide to scratch before the Regatta should inform the Entries Secretary by e-mail.
- 18. A representative of every crew must confirm its intention to race to the Entries Secretary at the Regatta, not later than 90 minutes before the time of the first race in the event for which it has been entered. This instruction includes those crews registering for a time trial under Regulation 11 above.
- 19. Crew changes under the Rules of Racing must be notified to the Entries Secretary before the crew goes afloat. Those notifying crew changes at the Regatta should be able to provide details of the substitute's registered club, name, date of birth and racing licence number as recorded by the relevant Great Britain Rowing Body.
- 20. Crews withdrawing from an event should inform the Entries Secretary and should note that once withdrawn they cannot be reinstated.
- 21. All racing licences must be available at registration. The Entries Secretary may ask to see them and/or retain them and a crew will not be able to register until it has complied with such a request.
- 22. Competitors in LTA, TA and AS events should confirm their classification at registration.
- 23. Crews should retain their Confirmation of Entry and Weight Certificate, which will be inspected by officials during the Regatta. Competitors weighing in should present their racing licence and Confirmation of Entry and Weight Certificate slip at weigh-in.
- 24. Crews qualifying for finals will be required to present their racing licences and Confirmation of Entry and Weight Certificate in order to be given a lane number.
